NHS Drink to Improve Your Digestion

The occasional fry-up or alcohol binge is unlikely to give you anything more than a short-lived stomach upset. But overindulge too often and you could be storing up trouble for yourself. Here's a tummy-friendly diet to aim for.

Drinking plenty of fluids to aid digestion is very important. The Eatwell Guide says we should drink 6 to 8 cups or glasses of fluid a day. Water, lower-fat milk and sugar-free drinks, including tea and coffee, all count.

Water

Water is a healthy and cheap choice for quenching your thirst at any time. It has no calories and contains no sugars that can damage teeth. A good way to make sure you're getting enough fluids is to drink a glass of water with every meal.

Plain tea, fruit tea and coffee (without added sugar) can also be healthy.

If you do not like the taste of plain water, try sparkling water or add a slice of lemon or lime. Or heat the water and infuse a tea bag, some coffee or a slice of lemon.

You could also add some no-added-sugar squash or fruit juice for flavour.

Semi-skimmed, 1% fat or skimmed milk

Milk is a good source of calcium, a mineral that helps build and maintain healthy bones. Milk also contains protein, vitamins and other minerals and does not cause tooth decay.

For a healthier choice choose semi-skimmed, 1% fat or skimmed milk.

Limit your intake of sugary flavoured milks.

Milk is particularly important for young children. They should drink whole milk until they're 2 years.



Juices, smoothies and 5 A Day

Fruit, vegetable juices and smoothies contain a variety of vitamins and minerals.

A 150ml glass of unsweetened fruit juice, vegetable juice or

smoothie can count as a maximum of 1 portion of your recommended 5 daily portions of fruit and vegetables.

Fizzy drinks, flavoured waters, and squashes

Fizzy drinks, squashes and juice drinks can contain lots of added sugar and very few nutrients, so keep them to a minimum. Flavoured water drinks can also contain a surprisingly large amount of sugar so check before you buy.

Tea and coffee

It's fine to drink tea and coffee as part of a balanced diet. Bear in mind that

caffeinated drinks can make the body produce urine more quickly.

A wide variety of tablet or granular artificial sweeteners are available and are safe to consume in hot drinks.

Energy drinks and caffeine

Energy drinks often contain high levels of caffeine and are often high in sugar (calories).

The caffeine levels in these drinks vary, but there's often around 80mg of caffeine in a small 250ml can. This is the same as 2 cans of cola or a small mug of coffee.

100 Years Ago...

Local Historian Simon Wilkinson looks back to Upton news content 100 years ago.

The Opening of the Coop Shop in1922.

The Co-op was never just a retail shop. In August 1922 The Upton News reported that "The Worcester Co-operative Society, in connection with their Upton-on-Severn Branch, organised a most successful gala for children and that this took place in ideal conditions on Saturday afternoon." Having processed from the Hanley Road behind the society's banner the children paused for "pictures" at the Memorial Hall Cinema (The romantic drama "Greater than Fame" was being advertised to the public, but hardly seems suitable!), and then went to the Cricket Ground led by the Upton Band. The "juveniles, to the number of about 400" happily indulged in sports and games, and tea was served. Mr Hewett's "Punch and Judy" show proved the main attraction. The prizes for the sports were presented by Mrs Knight, the wife of the local branch manager, who had organised the gala. At 7pm it was all over, the National Anthem was played and "the children dispersed to their homes tired but happy."

The Worcester Co-operative Society was founded in March 1881. In June 1901, after pressure from their existing members in Upton, the committee was persuaded to open the Society's fifth branch: it was on the west side of Old Street and was in premises which were leased for three years. Members increased: in one month over 60 joined from Upton. As the lease was short it was decided to purchase a shop, and, in January 1904, £250 was spent in buying what is now 23, Old Street. In June 1904 the new shop was opened with a flourish. The steamer The Duchess of York was hired for £6 6s 0d to bring the visitors from Worcester, the band played and Mr Roy, a long serving member of the Committee who performed the opening ceremony, was presented with a silver gilt key. The photograph shows that ceremony with the band and the Society's banner in front of the new shop. (The Banner: "Labor and Wait" was the Co-operative Wholesale Society motto. An American spelling indicated their antislavery stance. Worcester stayed English!)

In 1909 Mr Knight, who was to be paid £1 10s 0d per week, arrived as the new manager. There had been constant complaints of "leakage" of stock whilst his predecessor had been in post: these ceased and Mr Knight remained manager for many years. In 1910 land in Minge Lane was purchased and stables, shed, coalyard, bakery and a house for the manager were erected there (8, Minge Lane).

Extensive internal alterations were made to the shop premises in 1916, but, by 1925, Upton members were asking the Committee for a better home for the grocery department. It was decided to bring all departments together at The Upton Bon Marche which the Society had purchased in 1923 as a going concern which was trading in drapery and clothing to which boots and shoes had been added. In October 1926 the combined and extended store was opened. The name The Upton Bon Marche was soon dropped and the current Co-op came into existence. The old shop was sold after thoughts of turning it into a chemists had been rejected.

Councillor Martin Allen's County and District Report



With the successful Blues Festival now behind us, I'd like to thank all those who organised and supported it. So many gave their time for free and I have nothing but admiration for them. I also personally really enjoyed going!

NEW MINERAL PLAN: disaster for Ripple & Uckinghall?

In July at the full County Council meeting, the new Mineral Plan was voted in. I have requested a review due to a terrible flaw within it. Silica dust which can be produced within the extraction can lead to an incurable lung disease. There was originally a 200 metre protection zone in place, so that mineral extraction could not take place if six or more dwellings were within this zone. This has now gone for good.

I raised concerns of the danger caused by removing this to those that head the administration. Unfortunately, this fell on deaf ears!

I understand that if we want more schools, cycleways and pavements we need minerals but the balance must be right and not endanger young lungs.

With applications coming forward for Ripple and Uckinghall, I will wait to see how the companies applying for the right to extract propose to keep residents safe.

As part of the Planning Committee at County Hall, I will keep an open mind about each application and judge it on its own merit. You may be interested to know that I called for a named vote, so you can find out who voted for or against the new plan. Only 12 voted against it. For me, this was a sad day where I feel we all lost.

COST OF LIVING CRISIS

Due to the war in Ukraine the issues caused by Covid as people start returning to work, and of course Brexit, millions of households across the UK are struggling to make their incomes stretch to cover the rising cost of living. Local churches, charities and foodbanks are providing immediate support but I wanted to highlight support the government was providing and what Malvern Hills District Council is doing to ensure people are aware of the money they are entitled to and what money they should expect over the coming months. To help support the most affected, the government is providing over £37 billion this year alone. This means that almost all of the eight million most vulnerable households will get up to £1,200 of one-off support in total this year to help with the cost of living, with all domestic electricity customers receiving at least £400. Households will get £400 of support with their energy bills through an expansion




of the Energy Bills Support Scheme. The full payment will now be made as a grant, which will not be recovered through higher impacted by higher bills in future years. Energy suppliers will deliver this support to households with a domestic electricity meter over six months from October. Direct debit and credit customers will have the money credited to their account, while customers with pre-payment meters will have the money applied to their meter or paid via a voucher. This support is in addition to the £150 Council Tax rebate for households in England in Council Tax bands A-D, which was announced in February, and which MHDC has administered and paid to those who qualify. Payments were also made to people who were in receipt of state aid in properties that were in higher bands, recognising that some people may be asset rich but cash poor and in need of additional support.

More than 8 million households on means tested benefits will receive a payment of £650 this year, made in two instalments. This includes all households receiving benefits including, for example, Universal Credit, Income support, Pension Credit and Child Tax credit.

> The DWP has made the first payment in July and the second will be paid in the autumn. Payments from HMRC for those on tax credits only will follow shortly after each to avoid duplicate payments.

Pensioners are disproportionately



This additional one-off payment will go to the over 8 million pensioner households across the UK who receive the Winter Fuel Payment and will be paid on top of any other one-off support a pensioner household is entitled to, for example, where they are on Pension Credit or receive disability benefits.

Around six million people across the UK who receive disability benefits such as the Disability Living Allowance will receive a one-off payment of £150 from September. For the many disability benefit recipients who receive means tested benefits, this £150 will come on top of the £650 they will receive separately. Lastly, to support people who need additional help, the Government is providing an extra £500 million of local support, via the Household Support Fund, which will be extended from this October to March 2023. The Household Support Fund helps those in most need with payments towards the rising cost of food, energy, and water bills. Most of the payments will come automatically, but feel free to contact Malvern Hills District Council should you require any additional information.

And of course, keep an eye out for your neighbours who may be suffering at this time.



Mrs Cooke has been an absolute asset to Hanley, leading all the students that have passed through in her 12 years as headteacher to be the very best they can be. I wish her the happiest retirement.

It is difficult to imagine Hanley Castle without Mrs Cooke. She has been an ever-present influence throughout my time at Hanley and I do not doubt that the case is the same for every other Hanley student.

There is no student at Hanley Castle, who does not have a fond or funny memory of Mrs Cooke: her covid lunchtime duties on the tennis courts, her visits to our classrooms halfway through a lesson to comment jokingly on the contents of a new display board or class activity, or her meetings with students, school council, and clubs.

There are countless times that I and many other students have been supported by her academically and personally, even if just a smiling face during a difficult time. There is one thing I can say with absolute certainty. Everyone at Hanley wishes her all the best with whatever she finds herself doing in future and, by everyone at Hanley, her presence will be missed.

Seven Reasons to Get Excited About Bar 7

As local chef and restaurateur Kyle Hassall takes the reins at Bar 7, Upton News explores his plansto steer the venue in a new direction. Written by Will Hewlett

If you have ever tasted tapas at The Boathouse or polished off a pizza at Mojitos, you may be familiar with Kyle Hassall, the mind behind both Upton restaurants. Having moved from Derbyshire to Upton in 2014, Kyle applied twelve years of experience to establish The Boathouse, having identified a space in the market for his tapas-themed venture. Six years later our high street became home to Mojitos, a partner restaurant focusing on fresh pizza and rum-based cocktails. Now, following a twelve-month collaboration with late-night venue Bar 7, Kyle has recognized another opportunity to provide residents and tourists with something a little different. After meeting Kyle to discuss this upcoming endeavour, here are seven things to look forward to in Bar 7's future...

Moving away from its former identity as a social club, Bar 7 underwent significant re-branding and refurbishment in 2021. This garnered positive reactions from locals as it opened Bar 7 into one of the largest venue capacities in town, with a lounge area, games room and rear functions room leading out into a sun-soaked beer garden. If you're looking somewhere to host a function, Bar 7 will provide free room hire with catering and entertainment packages available upon request. Kyle's involvement with Bar 7 began shortly before this refurbishment, allowing him to prepare the venue for the 2021 UEFA European Football Championship. Kyle opted to screen significant games throughout the tournament, with England's success bringing a strong viewership to Bar 7. This planted an idea which would define Bar 7's current trajectory – does Bar 7 have the potential to become a sports bar? Kyle is confident that it does. 'Not many places show mainstream sports, so it just seemed like a natural concept to run with', he told us. 'With the World Cup coming up, we want to be the local venue that screens the England games'. Kyle plans to show all manner of live sports via subscriptions to BT and Sky Sports packages, ranging from Formula 1 to football and boxing.

Becoming a sports bar will give Bar 7 scope to increase its opening hours later in the year. Various fixtures throughout the week will appeal to all manner of sports fans, allowing for regular special events like Wednesday night Champion's League games and Sky Sports' Super Sundays. The current weekend opening hours are set to change with the bar opening at 5pm and closing at midnight, marking a shift away from late-night service in light of its new focus. New Sunday opening hours will accommodate back-to-back Premier League games from 12pm to 6pm. Although the sports focus is prominent, Bar 7 won't be turning its back on live entertainment any time soon. In fact, the venue has teamed up with a local entertainment agency to ensure a regular rotation of high quality acts, from solo acts to tribute bands and comedy nights. Local favourites are also expected to return, including The Bones, The Ferrets and The Rhythm Machine,

who are set to perform on New Years Eve. Both live entertainment and sports screenings will be advertised in an official 12 month calendar created by local graphic designer John Dickinson, to be made available online and in print.

Traditional pub sports are also set to make a comeback. Currently, Bar 7 features both three dart boards and three pool tables. There's already a resident pool team, but Kyle plans to expand with two-to-three teams, as well as a darts team that will enter into various leagues throughout Worcestershire. Beyond this, we've heard talk of dominoes competitions, a 'Pub Olympics' and a myriad of quirky games including giant Jenga, air hockey, virtual bowling, virtual darts and table football.

Bar 7 will be linking up with Mojitos, The Boathouse and Thrishna to provide food during halftime at these special screenings and events. The restaurants will supply and deliver a diverse range of appetizing delights, serving as perfect accompaniments to the continuously expanding drinks range. Kyle plans to facilitate Bar 7's evolution with established resources, supplementing the current team with new members, including a Worcester-based mixologist and a new manager that locals may just recognise...

If you aren't already enthusiastic about Kyle's Bar 7 roadmap, then perhaps you may want to read a little more about a planned loyalty card scheme. Card holders will be entitled to a twenty-percent discount across all drinks, as well as free entry to ticketed live entertainment. There is no fee attached to the card – regulars need just apply at the bar. As Kyle explains to Upton News, 'We've enjoyed the last 12 months, meeting new regulars and watching the business grow. Now, the opportunity has come to take over as sole director and evolve the business.'The grand re-opening of Bar 7 will take place on Wednesday 10th August.

Young people having their say in Malvern Hills District

It has been a busy two years for the Youth Forum at Malvern Hills District Council and the Council is now looking for more young people to get involved.

Since its formation in 2020, they have been involved in a number of consultations and attended Council to tell local councillors about their priorities. They have also included a number of questions within the recent Bigger Picture Survey on what it is like to live, work and study in the district, completed by over 1000 local young people. They have also allocated over £2000 of Youth Chair funding to local projects that have been developed by young people.

Malvern Hills District Council is now looking for its next Youth Chair and new Youth Advisors to join the team.

What can you expect?

This is an opportunity to develop a number of key life skills including working in a diverse team, written and presentation skills, managing a budget and more. The Youth Forum will agree their own priorities, in the last two years these have been mental wellbeing and the environment and currently developing an idea to hold a Youth Climate Summit.

Average time commitment for the role is approximately two hours per month and there is a team day held twice a year.

Matthew Knight, former Youth Chairperson said: "I would absolutely encourage people to get involved. I think that young people shaping their own futures is really important. It was a great opportunity for me."

Who can apply?

Those aged 11-17 yrs who live and/or study in the Malvern Hills District.

Need some funding for a project?

Young people come up with the idea and pitch it to fellow young people. Take a look at Malvern Hills District Council's webpage for more details.

Funded projects in the last 2 years: Students at Hanley Castle High School's Chess Club received £365 to expand the club (which has over 40 members), purchase new boards and clocks and host a tournament.



Students at Tenbury High Ormiston Academy received £500 towards the purchasing and furnishing of its "Time-To-Talk" cabin, providing a safe space for students to talk about their wellbeing without fear of judgement



Young people at Malvern Cube youth projects received £400 to hold a big birthday bash for all of the young people at the centre who had missed out on celebrating their birthdays during the pandemic.

Green Finger's Top Tips For August

Sultry Late Summer

August is usually one of the hottest months of the year - making watering essential. Try to use grey water wherever possible, especially as water butts may be running low if it has been a dry summer. August is traditionally holiday-time, so you might need to enlist the help of friends and family to look after the garden while you are away. When you are at home, take the time to prune Wisteria and summer-flowering shrubs such as lavender once they've finished flowering.



Wisteria needs regular pruning to keep the growth and size under control, but it will also improve the flowering display.



Deadhead flowering plants regularly

Remove spent flowers as soon as they look scruffy thankfully, a few days delay won't make a difference. The simplest method is to just pinch off the faded blooms with finger and thumb.



Don't delay summer pruning fruits trained as restricted forms

Summer pruning is mainly for apples and pears trained as restricted forms. It will allow sunlight to ripen the fruit and ensure good cropping for the following year.

Jobs for August

Water containers and new plants, preferably with grey recycled water or stored rainwater Collect seed from garden plants

Harvest sweetcorn and other vegetables as they become ready

Continue cutting out old fruited canes on raspberries

Lift and pot up rooted strawberry runners

Keep ponds and water features topped up

Last month, world leaders gathered at the G7 summit in Germany and then the NATO summit in Madrid. The war in Ukraine continues to dominate the diplomatic conversations and I am sure readers will join me in the continued



support for every effort to standing up to the illegal Russian invasion of a sovereign state, including supplying defensive weaponry.

Whilst leaders are strong on the international stage, each of them has to return home to face increasing financial pressures - rising inflation and much higher energy and fuel prices. I sit on the Treasury Select Committee and I have been urging the Governor of the Bank of England to act to keep inflation under control – something he has singularly failed to do – and he must act decisively now.

This means that people are facing increased prices in the daily shop and some people are worried about the heating bills now and as we approach the winter. There are a number of specific schemes to help people. The Government is providing a £15 billion energy bill rebate package, worth up to £550 each for around 28 million households - all domestic energy customers will receive a £400 grant to help with the cost of their energy bills. More than 8 million households on means tested benefits will receive £650 as well.

All pensioner households will receive an extra £300 to help them cover the rising cost of energy this winter, on top of their annual winter heating payments and I'm urging pensioners to look at the Government website to see if they are entitled to any extra support including Pension Credit.

The Household Support Fund will provide £1 billion this financial year to help households who are not eligible for other kinds of help or need further support and I have been working closely with the local Citizens Advice Bureau team who are managing this support.

The National Living Wage has increased by 6.6 per cent, the National Insurance threshold has increased to £12,750 this month and fuel and alcohol duties have been relaxed – each of these important measures as people manage their own, increasing, household budgets.
